

First Reading: Sirach 27:4-7

2025 Lenten Obligations

- 1) The days of both fast and abstinence are Ash Wednesday (March 5) and Good Friday (April 18).
- 2) The other Fridays of Lent (Mar. 7, 14, 21, 28; April 4, and 11) are days of abstinence.
- 3) Fasting in the Roman Catholic tradition means to limit oneself to one full meal with two smaller meals which together do not equal the size of your full meal. The obligation of fasting applies only to Catholics between ages of 18 and 59.
- 4) Abstinence in the Roman Catholic tradition means to abstain from eating meat (beef, chicken, pork, turkey, etc.). The obligation od abstinence applies to all Catholics who have reached the age of 14.

We will have masses at **7am**, **12:10pm**, and **7pm**, with distribution of ashes.

A note from Fr. Krull

We are now in the countdown to Lent. Within three days time, we will be faced with the necessity of making choices, some of them painful, notice, not melancholy. We don't heave a sad sigh as our dietary regimes take a plainer turning (although there are some foods that I love to have during this season!), we don't cast a last longing look at the martini pitcher or start whimpering and crying as we pass the candy aisle in ShopRite – all the while planning the blowout of parties for Easter evening! Lent reminds us of taking up crosses, as Christ did. However, Christ took His up willingly. This should give us a new perspective to this season, taking away from it all the late winter wetness and gloom. The word "lent" actually comes from an Old English word for Spring – and with days getting longer (don't forget to turn your clocks ahead on Saturday!), those signs are all around us.

With Lent now upon us, I encourage you to make the most of this great season of grace. Please make the effort to get to daily Mass - the readings we have this season say so much. Stations of the Cross begin this Friday evening, a beautiful devotion that many of us have participated in over the vears. One thing that I will be doing here is offering a video presentation, "A Biblical Walk Through the Mass" by Dr. Edward Sri. I used this program last year and we had an incredible response to it, getting nearly 75-80 people every week to learn more about the Mass, the central praver of the Church. This five week program will be held in Lourdes Hall on the Wednesdays of Lent beginning on March 12th at 7:00 PM. I hope many of you will join us! I want to invite you to attend a parish Mission at Our Lady of Peace this Thursday through Saturday. Fr. Jim Tucker, who is in residence with me there will be doing this Mission. The mission talk on Thursday will be at 7:00 PM, on Friday after Stations of the Cross (around 7:30) and will end with the 5:00 Mass this Saturday. I'll also be offering Dr. Sri's five week video series, "No Greater Love: A Biblical Walk Through the Passion", which will be held on the Five Sundays of Lent beginning on March 9th. These will be held in the chapel at Our Lady of Peace, beginning at 9:30 AM. And we're having our famous Friday Night Fish Dinners on March 14th and 28th and April 12th. I know many of you join us for those, so I wanted to let you know that they are on!

Again, I invite and encourage all of you to make the most of this great season of grace. Ash Wednesday is just the start. The readings we've had the last few Sundays have been great ones to help us look at our lives seriously to see where we need to grow as followers of Christ, to help us see what we really need to give up, not just for this season, but for life. So let's continue to pray for each other this season, that the new life Christ won for us through His death and resurrection may shine through us all.
